From the Chairman Our First Membership-Wide Vote



As you know, the CHPA Board worked with special counsel as a consultant to revise our bylaws and propose those revised bylaws for a vote by members. We wanted all Pilot and Crew voting members to have a say in the matter, and so to follow our existing bylaws, the Board appointed me as a Delegate in all 50 states to poll members. With the aid of Terry Garlock, we used email to collect your opinions, and my job was to represent you by casting your vote at the Annual Meeting held on Oct 15.

Now I want to report to you the result of your vote. There was just one vote cast at the meeting that had not been counted by email. Once I cast all of your votes on your behalf at the meeting, the count was as follows:

202 Yes votes 34 No votes 236 Total votes

By then existing bylaws, 25% of voting members must vote to have a quorum. As of Oct 15, the day of the Annual Meeting, we had 505 voting members, BUT 12 of them had expired on 8/31 and had not yet renewed, and

3 of them had expired on 9/30 and had not yet renewed. Accordingly, 505 less 15 pending renewal leaves 490 active voting members. 25% of 490 is 122.5 or 123 votes required to have a quorum. Since we had 236 votes, the quorum requirement was met.

There is another requirement that intentionally makes changing the bylaws a high hurdle. 2/3 of the votes cast must be Yes votes to change the bylaws. Of the total 236 votes, 2/3 is 158, and since we had 202 Yes votes, that hurdle was cleared and, in compliance with our existing bylaws, the new bylaws have been adopted.

The new bylaws can be reviewed on our website at any time. We believe the added flexibility in the new bylaws will be good for CHPA's future.

Whether you voted Yes or No, thank you for participating in the very first member vote that did not require your presence at the Annual Meeting.

We had some technical glitches in the voting process, and we made a mistake in trying to prevent member arguments on the issues. We have learned from it and will endeavor to improve. On the next occasion for a vote we will open a comment period to invite members to share their views, while those who don't like the backand-forth will be encouraged to use their delete key. Then when the comment period is over we will ask for quiet so members can vote in peace.

Membership-wide voting is an important step for all of us. It was my privilege to be involved as your representative.

18 Mar 1967 in the Long Green

I was an Australian soldier picked up by a US chopper crew on 18 March 1967 at about 2130 hours in an area called the Long Green. I suffered a GSW to my leg and was taken to 36 Evac at Vung Tau. Our platoon had set an ambush on a track system about 2 kls from the town of Dat Do. I was with the Reconnaissance Platoon of 5 Battalion Royal Australian Regiment . Our skipper used two zippo lighters in outstretched arms to guide the chopper in. With the enemy close he expected to be killed. We didn't know whether it would be the RAAF or US chopper. I've been told that I said to the crew, "You RAAF took your time", and the answer was "We're not the RAAF. It will be 50 years next year since I was wounded and it would be great if I could find out something about the brave crew that got me safely to hospital.

My name is Tony Twaits and I live in Tasmania, Australia. At the time I was 20 years old and had red hair. It is a long shot, but you never know.

You earned it: veteran benefits Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) by Gordon Eatley

Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC)

DIC is a monthly stipend that can be **paid to your spouse or dependent child in** the event of your death due to service connected disabilities. Certain conditions apply. If your spouse is receiving SBA (survivor benefit pay) it may be offset by the amount of DIC she/he receives. Organizations such as MOA and others are fighting to have this offset eliminated. Of course, if you are not drawing a military retirement this does not affect you. You can find eligibility and rates at these links http://www.benefits.va.gov/compensation/resources.comp03.asp-BM01

DIC will pay Basic Monthly Rate **\$1215** (38 U.S.C. 1311(a)(1))

Additional Allowances:

- Add \$258 if at the time of the veteran's death, the veteran was in receipt of or entitled to receive compensation for a service-connected disability rated totally disabling (including a rating based on individual employability) for a continuous period of at least 8 years immediately preceding death AND the surviving spouse was married to the veteran for those same 8 years. (38 U.S.C. 1311(a)(2))
- 2. Add the following allowance for each dependent child under age 18: ffective 12/1/12 **\$301** per child (38 U.S.C. 1311(b))

- 3. If the surviving spouse is entitled to A&A, add \$301. (38 U.S.C. 1311(c))
- 4. If the surviving spouse is entitled to Housebound, add \$141 (38 U.S.C. 1311(d))

Who is eligible?

Eligibility (Surviving Spouse)

To qualify for DIC, a surviving spouse must meet the requirements below.

The surviving spouse was:

- Married to a Service member who died on active duty, active duty for training, or inactive duty training, OR
- Validly married the Veteran before January 1, 1957, OR
- Married the Veteran within 15 years of discharge from the period of military service in which the disease or injury that caused the Veteran's death began or was aggravated, OR
- Was married to the Veteran for at least one year, OR
- Had a child with the Veteran, AND
- Cohabited with the Veteran continuously until the Veteran's death or, if separated, was not at fault for the separation, AND
- Is not currently remarried

Note: A surviving spouse who remarries on or after December 16, 2003, and on or after attaining age 57, is entitled to continue to receive DIC.

Eligibility (Surviving Child)

- Not included on the surviving spouse's DIC, AND
- Unmarried, AND
- Under age 18, or between the ages of 18 and 23 and attending school.
